Visitor Etiquette

The Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska welcome guests to visit their community, cultural centers and events. When visiting Winnebago and attending ceremonies, guests should maintain a respectful decorum. Please remember the following rules of etiquette when visiting these sites:

- Ask for permission before taking photos and videos.
- Items found in Winnebago should not be taken as souvenirs, as it is against federal law to remove artifacts found on Native American reservations.
- Please refrain from whistling once the sun starts to set.

Angel De Cora Museum and Research Center

The mission of the museum is to identify, preserve, protect, and promote the history, art, culture, accomplishments and sacrifices of the Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska and its people. The museum also provides the community and public an opportunity to explore, learn, and experience the rich and unique history and culture.

Honoring-the-Clans Sculpture Garden

Experience the heritage of the Winnebago Tribe. Twelve statues, each representing one of the tribe's clans, are arranged in a large circle at the heart of the tribe's Ho-Chunk Village.

Winnebago Pow Wow Grounds

The home of the annual Homecoming Celebration commemorating the return of Chief Little Priest and the Company "A" Scouts. The four-day celebration is held during the last full weekend in July.

Buffalo Pasture

Visit the Winnebago Tribe's herd of Buffalo.

- Sculpt Siouxland Find sculptures throughout downtown created by Midwestern artists
- <u>Sgt. Floyd Monument</u> The 100-foot sandstone obelisk honors Sgt. Charles Floyd, the only member of the crew to die during the Lewis & Clark Expedition
- <u>Sgt. Floyd River Museum & Welcome Center</u> The decommissioned US Army Corps of Engineers inspection boat provides a valuable lesson in Missouri River history
- <u>Sioux City Art Center</u> The award-winning free facility includes blockbuster exhibits in addition to a permanent collection and Hands-On Gallery for children
